

SCOTLANDS TE KITEROA CHARITABLE TRUST

Q. WHAT IS THIS TRUST?

- A. The Trust originated from proceeds from the sale of the Scotlands (Auckland) and Te Kiteroa (Waimate) Rest Homes.
A Charitable Trust was formed in 1982.
Each year interest from the Trust funds is disbursed to the community.

Q. WHO CAN APPLY FOR GRANTS?

- A. Any individual or group.

Q. WHAT ARE THE CRITERIA?

- A. The maximum grant considered is \$1,500.00 and shall be in the following categories
- i. The welfare of children and the elderly
 - ii. Community
 - iii. Conservation
 - iv. Education

The following categories are among those that will not be considered, housing, buildings, religion, employment, justice, hui, personal expenses and salaries, education outside New Zealand.

All applications must be deemed charitable.

Q. HOW LONG IS THEIR TERM OF OFFICE?

- A. Rural Women New Zealand members are appointed annually for a maximum of six years.
Nominations for Rural Women New Zealand Trust members need to be at the office by August 31st.
Non Rural Women New Zealand members have no restriction on their length of term, but are appointed annually.

Q. DOES THE TRUST NEED DONATIONS?

- A. YES. This is Rural Women New Zealand's Trust and donations to it will continue to be welcomed to build up the reserves. Over the years WDFW/RWNZ Branches, Provincials and members have given away thousands of dollars to worthwhile community charities, in their areas and nationally.

Q. WHO ADMINISTERS THE TRUST?

A. The Trustees mentioned previously.

Q. HOW OFTEN DOES THE TRUST MEET?

A. The Trust meets once a year, to consider applications which must be in to the Secretary by 31st December each year. However urgent cases are considered and granted at any time. All Trustees receive a copy of the applications for their consideration and decisions are made jointly at the Trust meeting.

Q. WHEN DO APPLICANTS RECEIVE THEIR GRANTS?

A. All applicants are notified as soon as possible after the Trust meeting as to their success or otherwise.
